In 2009, freethinker William Bermudez started Hug an Atheist Day (June 1st) to poke fun at other groups popping up at the time to encouraged hugging. Wednesday, June 5, 2019

The goal of World Environment Day is to raise worldwide awareness of environmental issues, and to generate action for conservation. The United Nations General Assembly established World Environment Day in 1972 to mark the opening of the Stockholm Conference on the Human Environment. World Environment Day gives environmental issues a human face. The philosophy has changed little over the last three decades; it still strives to associate faces with issues and

empower people to be advocates of sustainable and equitable development. Let us consider carefully the actions which each of us must take, and then address ourselves to our common task of preserving all life on earth in a mood of sober resolution and quiet confidence."

➤ Solstice (June) Friday, June 21, 2019

Called Summer Solstice in the northern hemisphere, Winter Solstice in the southern, people have marked the **June Solstice** one way or another for thousands of years. Many religions have seasonal holy days linked to this day. It is the day when the Northern Hemisphere has more daylight than at any other time of the year. In the Southern Hemisphere, the least daylight occurs this day in June. (The exact date of the June Solstice varies from year to year, but usually it is between the 20th and 23rd of June.)



"Solstice" comes from two Latin words: "sol" (meaning sun) and "sistere," (to cause to stand still). At noon in either hemisphere the sun will be high in the sky during summer, low during winter. On the day with the greatest number of daylight hours, the sun reaches its maximum elevation; we call this the Summer Solstice. Likewise, the day with the least daylight is the Winter Solstice.

In the Northern Hemisphere, the June Solstice is officially the first day of summer, also called Midsummer because it comes roughly during the midst of the growing season in Europe.

> Torture Victims' Day Wednesday, June 26, 2019

In 1997, the United Nations General Assembly passed resolution **52/149**, establishing June 26 as the United Nations International Day in Support of Victims of Torture. The goal is the eradication of torture and the functioning of the Convention against Torture and Other Cruel, Inhuman or Degrading Treatment or Punishment. This day gives all an opportunity to stand united against cruelty, and remember that torture is a violation of basic human rights.

Clearly the abolition of torture is a key issue to freethinkers and humanists, and too often the worst perpetrators of this atrocity are highly religious societies. But secular societies have been far from innocent. This is a cause where we can often join hands with our religious brothers and sisters.







New poll finds church membership down to 50% among Americans

According to a recent <u>Gallup poll</u>, people who belong to a church or some other religious institution has dropped 20 percentage points over the last 20 years, hitting a low of 50 percent last year.

In 1999, church membership was at 70 percent but has fallen ever since. In regards to the percentage of adults in the U.S. who claim no religious affiliation, that number has jumped from 8 percent to 19 percent.

The Catholic Church has seen a significant drop as well, with people who identify as Catholic dropping 13 percentage points over the last two decades. Protestants saw a drop in membership of 73 percent to 67 percent. Hispanic Americans saw one of the biggest declines in church membership, from 68 percent to 45 percent since the year 2000. When it comes to political affiliation, Democrats saw a much larger decline than Republicans. According to Gallup, Dems fell from 71 percent to 48 percent, compared to a small drop for Republicans — 77 percent to 69 percent.


Speaking to the <u>Associated Press</u>, Boston University sociology professor **Nancy Ammerman** said the declines are due to changing cultural and generational factors. "Culturally, we are seeing significant erosion in the trust people have for institutions in general and churches in particular," she said. "We are also seeing a generational shift as the 'joiner' older generation dies off and a generation of non-joiners comes on the scene."

The <u>Friendly Atheist</u>'s **Hemant Mehta** thinks the changes are also due to more sinister reasons, namely the sex abuse scandals that have rocked religion, along with the increasingly apparent hypocrisy of its leaders. In short, the declines shouldn't be "all that shocking," Mehta writes.

"The largest religious denominations in the country — Catholics, Southern Baptists, white evangelicals — have all been going through public sex abuse scandals that involve covering up the crimes on behalf of leaders," Mehta says. "White evangelical Christianity has also effectively become synonymous with the atrocities of the Republican Party and the Trump administration specifically.

"When that's what religion has to offer, what benefit do you gain by proclaiming yourself one of them?" he added. "Even beyond that, those organized religions oppose LGBTQ rights, reproductive freedom, scientific data, and sex education.

They stand for discriminating against gay people, not defending the poor. After a tragedy, they offer thoughts and prayers, not solutions."

Blast from the past. In 1995, the Bee's Religion page agreed to publish humanist & secular responses to moral questions along with views from local faith leaders. Grabbing the gauntlet, AOF's own **Pat Kelley** was soon submitting her own answers. Here is a highlight.

January 13, 1996. What would Jesus say to the Material Girl?

All that is known about Jesus is that he existed and was briefly an itinerant, apocalyptic preacher. Most information about Jesus comes from the Gospels, which are not historic documents but greatly embellished testimonies of faith written generations after his death. They said that Jesus was a radical, identifying with poor, downtrodden outcasts of society. He preached tolerance of a merciful god and a kingdom of love and peace. Most of his followers were members of the "fringe" and since Madonna is so outrageous, Jesus probably would feel quite comfortable around her. ... A true victim of free speech, Jesus's greatest crime was in advising followers to find a personal relationship with God - even if it meant disregarding authority. He was murdered for his outspoken attacks on priests, Pharisees, hypocrites and businesses. Today he might advise Madonna to become a "Spiritual Girl" and donate her wealth to groups that help protect individual rights to freedom of speech and religion.
